

# ADDITIONAL NOTES ON THE AMPGS PROJECT

## Employment

- At the peak of construction (roughly Spring 2009 to Fall 2012) AMP-Ohio expects the project to engage 800-1,000 professional and skilled-trades workers.
- Once the plant is on-line, approximately 150 workers will operate and maintain the facility on a full-time basis. In addition, approximately 16 jobs will be associated with the fertilizer operation, which is planned to be associated with the facility as part of the Powerspan process.



## Local Revenues

Based on an estimated value of approximately \$1.5-2-billion, initial estimates show that the plant will contribute approximately \$20-million to the local economy, including substantial support for the Southern Local School District.

## Economic Development

The large number of people involved in the construction and operation of the plant will bring significant economic development to the area. Local businesses will see an increase in the number of people utilizing products and services.



## Community Support

AMP-Ohio will be a good neighbor and active participant in the community. Plant managers will look for ways to participate in the community and encourage employees to be actively involved as well.

## Construction/Operation

There will be a temporary increase in



traffic during construction due to the large number of workers. Many of the components and materials needed to build and operate the plant, however, will be delivered by barge. AMP-Ohio is having discussions with state and local officials regarding a traffic study and the potential need for upgrades. We will continue to work on any appropriate controls that may be necessary to mitigate impacts.

**Noise:** The AMPGS facility will have a relatively minor impact on ambient noise levels in the area.
